This office is counsel to United Food and Commercial Workers Local 342 which Union has Collective Bargaining Agreements covering many of the debtors' store locations including the Waldbaums supermarket in Westhampton Beach.

The Debtors have served notice that the successful bidder for the Westhampton Beach store is Best Yet Market Inc. There is also a back-up bidder. Attached hereto find numerous letters from UFCW Local 342 members, members of the community as well as a petition from members of the Westhampton Beach community, all in opposition to the proposed sale to Best Yet Market Inc. as proposed in Document 1157.

The petitions and letters set forth the opinions of employees and community members that the store should not be sold to Best Yet Market Inc. who apparently does not intend to hire union employees and that the store should be sold instead to the back-up bidder who the Union believes will retain the Union employees. Surely the livelihoods of the workers should be factored in to any decision with respect to the issue of what bid should be approved.


I am a recent college graduate with many loans and bills to pay and just like my fellow co-workers we need a union shop to buy us and take the employees with them.


Dear Judge Drain,


